AUTOGRAPH LETTER Signed on her crested notepaper, from Berlin, n.d. [?1909] 2pp, to Mrs Dodds, explains she has left behind 'a sky blue letter case or call it large pocket book', to look on her dressing table, 'It was very stupid and tiresome of me leaving it behind'. (King Edward VII and Alexandra went on a state visit to Berlin in 1909.) With, Signed Card and Signed Envelope sent on the occasion of Mrs Dodds being the housekeeper at Marlborough House for 34 years, and an envelope containing printed embossed decorated silver A. Sold with further letters and cards from the Queen's daughters to Mrs Dodds:

Princess Louise, Duchess of Fife [1867-1931] Princess Royal, daughter of King Edward VII and Queen Alexandra, later wife of 6th Earl of Fife.

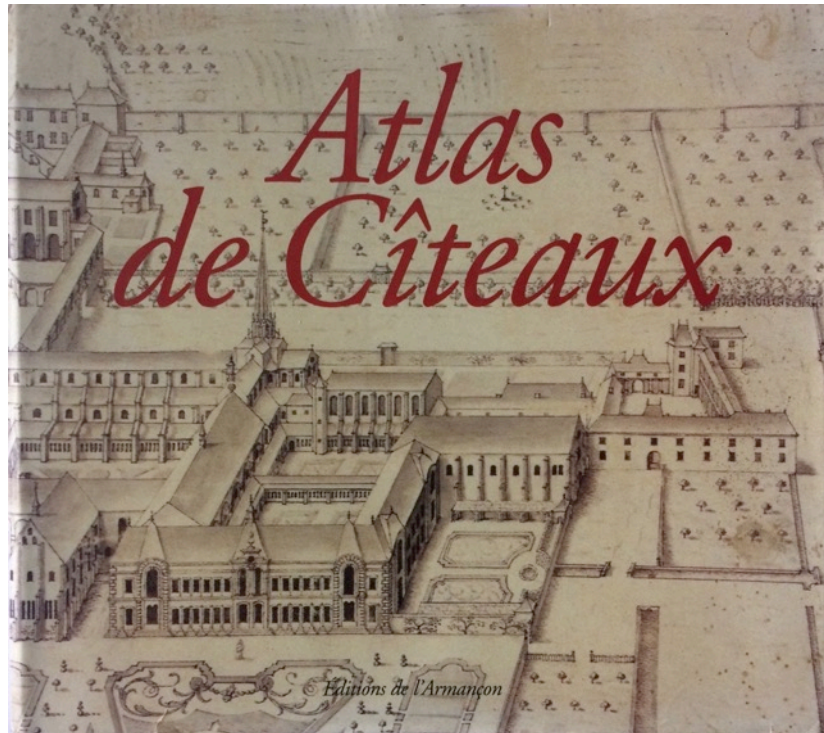

This scarce map which stretches as far East as the Caspian sea shows the routes across Europe.

Charles Picquet died in 1827 but his son continued to publish maps under his name. Following an uprising in Warsaw in 1830 which the Russians later quelled, Polish exiles who had supported the rebellion including army officers found their way to Western Europe, where they were given support from the liberal intelligentsia, particularly in France and England. In 1831, Prince Czartoryski visited England and told Lord Dudley Stuart [1803-1854] of the plight of his countrymen under Emperor Nicholas. Lord Dudley was instrumental in getting Parliament to vote £10,000 for the relief of the Poles, and he subsequently did much to aid the exiles and support their cause. Perhaps this map was produced in part to provide financial support to the Polish officers in exile.

Perhaps the number of foreign royalty was swelled by the upheavals in Europe in 1848.

Gloucester House was purchased by Prince William shortly before his marriage. It is where Princess Mary died. Queen Victoria wrote acknowledging how she had become the matriarch of the family, 'Her age, and her being a link with bygone times and generations . . . rendered her more and more dear and precious to us all, and we all looked upon her as a sort of grandmother'. But following the reports of Emily Hobhouse and Millicent Fawcett earlier in the year, in November 1901, the Colonial Secretary Joseph Chamberlain ordered Alfred Milner to ensure that 'all possible steps are being taken to reduce the rate of mortality', and that the civil authorities took over the running of the camps from the military. Presumably it was because of these changes Miss Vaughan applied to work in the camps. At this point, Lord Onslow was Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies and this letter is a reply to one from Lord Goschen [1831-1907], who was the First Lord of the Admiralty. Alfred Milner had been appointed governor of Cape Colony and high commissioner for South Africa in 1897.

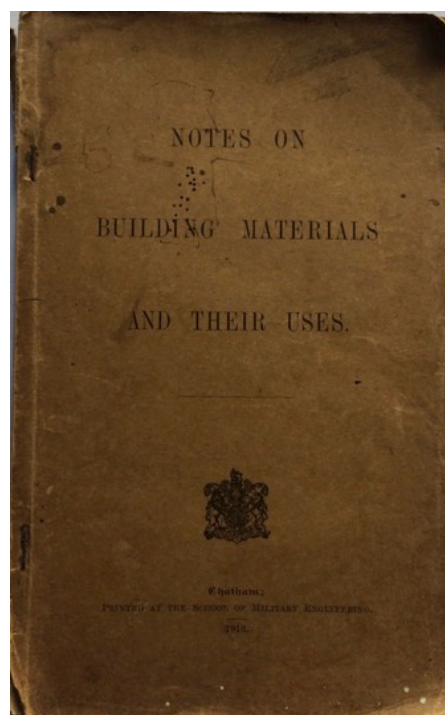
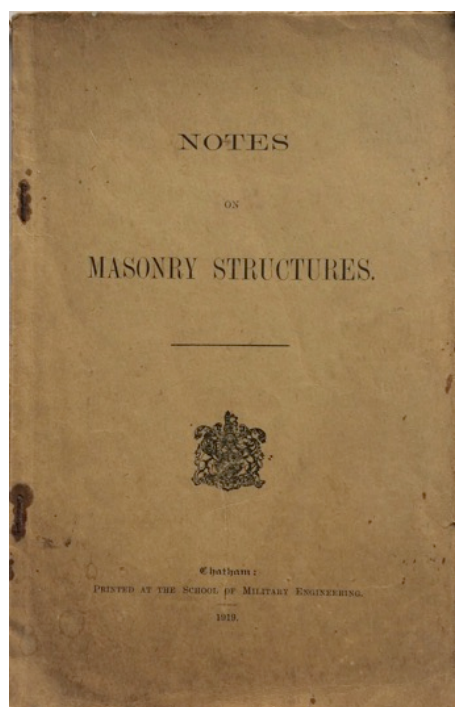
John Sampson [1862-1931] was described by Ian Hancock as 'the greatest scholar of Romani ever to have lived'. He was the first full-time librarian at Liverpool University College, later the University of Liverpool. He cultivated the society of gypsies and in 1894 he met Edward Wood near Bala, who spoke Romani 'as a pure Indian idiom'. He started to compile a dictionary of Welsh Romani and enlisted the support of four female 'disciples' including Dora Yates. It was published in 1926 as *The Dialect of the Gypsies of Wales*, the result of thirty years' research. In 1909 he rented a house near Corwen to serve as both a meeting place and a base for his Romany excursions. When his ashes were scattered on Foel Coch many gypsies attended, being led in the funeral procession by Augustus John, who as a teacher at Liverpool Art College had come to share Sampson's interest in gypsies.

No copy with this title on COPAC, but there is a record of a chapbook with the same publication details and the title 'The Rational humourist; being a choice collection of bon mots & pleasing witticisms, the whole purged from every thing obscene or indelicate, and forming a choice repository of chaste wit and rational humour'. It must be presumed the collection of 90 amusing anecdotes are the same, as the drophead title on their commencement reads 'The Rational Humourist'. It is possible the new title was used to suggest a different work was being offered to the public. In 1799, Vernon & Hood had published this work; 'The Rational Humourist: consisting of a selection of anecdotes, bon mots, &c. elegant, sentimental, and mirthful'. Perhaps Turner thought his original title was too similar to this work. Matthew Turner who also ran a circulating library, published a number of books, many with a religious theme.
